1. After this there was a feast of the Jews; and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

a. Jn 5:1-15 Jerus.-BethesdaPool

- 1. After this there was a feast of the Jews; and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.
- 2. Now there is at Jerusalem by the sheep market a pool, which is called in the Hebrew tongue Bethesda, having five porches.
- 3. In these lay a great multitude of impotent folk, of blind, halt, withered, waiting for the moving of the water.
- 4. For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had.
- 5. And a certain man was there, which had an infirmity thirty and eight years.
- 6. When Jesus saw him lie, and knew that he had been now a long time in that case, he saith unto him, Wilt thou be made whole?
- 7. The impotent man answered him, Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool: but while I am coming, another steppeth down before me.
- 8. Jesus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.
- 9. And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked: and on the same day was the sabbath.

- 10. The Jews therefore said unto him that was cured, It is the sabbath day: it is not lawful for thee to carry thy bed.
- 11. He answered them, He that made me whole, the same said unto me, Take up thy bed, and walk.
- 12. Then asked they him, What man is that which said unto thee, Take up thy bed, and walk?
- 13. And he that was healed wist not who it was: for Jesus had conveyed himself away, a multitude being in that place.
- 14. Afterward Jesus findeth him in the temple, and said unto him, Behold, thou art made whole: sin no more, lest a worse thing come unto thee.
- 15. The man departed, and told the Jews that it was Jesus, which had made him whole.

b. Jn 5:16:47 Father's Work

- 16. And therefore did the Jews persecute Jesus, and sought to slay him, because he had done these things on the sabbath day.
- 17. But Jesus answered them, My Father worketh hitherto, and I work.
- 18. Therefore the Jews sought the more to kill him, because he not only had broken the sabbath, but said also that God was his Father, making himself equal with God.
- 19. Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise.
- 20. For the Father loveth the Son, and sheweth him all things that himself doeth: and he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel.
- 21. For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and quickeneth them; even so the Son quickeneth whom he will.
- 22. For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son:
- 23. That all men should honour the Son, even as they honour the Father. He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him.
- 24. Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.
- 25. Verily, verily, I say unto you, The hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live.
- 26. For as the Father hath life in himself; so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself;
- 27. And hath given him authority to execute judgment also, because he is the Son of man.
- 28. Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice,
- 29. And shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation.
- 30. I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me.
- 31. If I bear witness of myself, my witness is not true.
- 32. There is another that beareth witness of me; and I know that the witness which he witnesseth of me is true.
- 33. Ye sent unto John, and he bare witness unto the truth.
- 34. But I receive not testimony from man: but these things I say, that ye might be saved.
- 35. He was a burning and a shining light: and ye were willing for a season to rejoice in his light.
- 36. But I have greater witness than that of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me.

- 37. And the Father himself, which hath sent me, hath borne witness of me. Ye have neither heard his voice at any time, nor seen his shape.
- 38. And ye have not his word abiding in you: for whom he hath sent, him ye believe not.
- 39. Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me.
- 40. And ye will not come to me, that ye might have life.
- 41. I receive not honour from men.
- 42. But I know you, that ye have not the love of God in you.
- 43. I am come in my Father's name, and ye receive me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive.
- 44. How can ye believe, which receive honour one of another, and seek not the honour that cometh from God only?
- 45. Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father: there is one that accuseth you, even Moses, in whom ye trust.
- 46. For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote of me.
- 47. But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe my words?

c. Mt 12:9-14 WitheredHand

- 9. And when he was departed thence, he went into their synagogue:
- 10. And, behold, there was a man which had his hand withered. And they asked him, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath days? that they might accuse him.
- 11. And he said unto them, What man shall there be among you, that shall have one sheep, and if it fall into a pit on the sabbath day, will he not lay hold on it, and lift it out?
- 12. How much then is a man better than a sheep? Wherefore it is lawful to do well on the sabbath days.
- 13. Then saith he to the man, Stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched it forth; and it was restored whole, like as the other.
- 14. Then the Pharisees went out, and held a council against him, how they might destroy him.

Mk 3:1-6 WitheredHand

- 1. And he entered again into the synagogue; and there was a man there which had a withered hand.
- 2. And they watched him, whether he would heal him on the sabbath day; that they might accuse him.
- 3. And he saith unto the man which had the withered hand, Stand forth.
- 4. And he saith unto them, Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? to save life, or to kill? But they held their peace.
- 5. And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he saith unto the man, Stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched it out: and his hand was restored whole as the other.
- 6. And the Pharisees went forth, and straightway took counsel with the Herodians against him, how they might destroy him.

Lu 6:6-11 WitheredHand

- 6. And it came to pass also on another sabbath, that he entered into the synagogue and taught: and there was a man whose right hand was withered.
- 7. And the scribes and Pharisees watched him, whether he would heal on the sabbath day; that they might find an accusation against him.

- 8. But he knew their thoughts, and said to the man which had the withered hand, Rise up, and stand forth in the midst. And he arose and stood forth.
- 9. Then said Jesus unto them, I will ask you one thing; Is it lawful on the sabbath days to do good, or to do evil? to save life, or to destroy it?
- 10. And looking round about upon them all, he said unto the man, Stretch forth thy hand. And he did so: and his hand was restored whole as the other.
- 11. And they were filled with madness; and communed one with another what they might do to Jesus.

d. Mt 12:15-21 SoMany?

- 15. But when Jesus knew it, he withdrew himself from thence: and great multitudes followed him, and he healed them all;
- 16. And charged them that they should not make him known:
- 17. That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying,
- 18. Behold my servant, whom I have chosen; my beloved, in whom my soul is well pleased: I will put my spirit upon him, and he shall shew judgment to the Gentiles.
- 19. He shall not strive, nor cry; neither shall any man hear his voice in the streets.
- 20. A bruised reed shall he not break, and smoking flax shall he not quench, till he send forth judgment unto victory.
- 21. And in his name shall the Gentiles trust.

Mk 3:7-12 SoMany?

- 7. But Jesus withdrew himself with his disciples to the sea: and a great multitude from Galilee followed him, and from Judaea,
- 8. And from Jerusalem, and from Idumaea, and from beyond Jordan; and they about Tyre and Sidon, a great multitude, when they had heard what great things he did, came unto him.
- 9. And he spake to his disciples, that a small ship should wait on him because of the multitude, lest they should throng him.
- 10. For he had healed many; insomuch that they pressed upon him for to touch him, as many as had plagues.
- 11. And unclean spirits, when they saw him, fell down before him, and cried, saving, Thou art the Son of God.
- 12. And he straitly charged them that they should not make him known.

19. Mount Pray, 12 Official, Teach-Heal-Intervention / Sermon

a. Mk 3:13-21 Mount Pray, -12 Official-Teach-Heal-Intervention

- 13. And he goeth up into a mountain, and calleth unto him whom he would: and they came unto him.
- 14. And he ordained twelve, that they should be with him, and that he might send them forth to preach,
- 15. And to have power to heal sicknesses, and to cast out devils:
- 16. And Simon he surnamed Peter;
- 17. And James the son of Zebedee, and John the brother of James; and he surnamed them Boanerges, which is, The sons of thunder:
- 18. And Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Canaanite,
- 19. And Judas Iscariot, which also betrayed him: and they went into an house.

- 20. And the multitude cometh together again, so that they could not so much as eat bread.
- 21. And when his friends heard of it, they went out to lay hold on him: for they said, He is beside himself.

Lu 6:12-19 Mount Pray-12 Official-Teach-Heal-Intervention

- 12. And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God.
- 13. And when it was day, he called unto him his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named apostles:
- 14. Simon, (whom he also named Peter,) and Andrew his brother, James and John, Philip and Bartholomew,
- 15. Matthew and Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon called Zelotes,
- 16. And Judas the brother of James, and Judas Iscariot, which also was the traitor.
- 17. And he came down with them, and stood in the plain, and the company of his disciples, and a great multitude of people out of all Judaea and Jerusalem, and from the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him, and to be healed of their diseases;
- 18. And they that were vexed with unclean spirits: and they were healed.
- 19. And the whole multitude sought to touch him: for there went virtue out of him, and healed them all.

b. Mt 5:1-48 Sermon A

- 1. And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him:
- 2. And he opened his mouth, and taught them, saying,
- 3. Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 4. Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.
- 5. Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.
- 6. Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.
- 7. Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.
- 8. Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.
- 9. Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.
- 10. Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 11. Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.
- 12. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.
- 13. Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted? it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men.
- 14. Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.
- 15. Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.
- 16. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.
- 17. Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil.
- 18. For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled.
- 19. Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach them, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

- 20. For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven.
- 21. Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment:
- 22. But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire.
- 23. Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee;
- 24. Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.
- 25. Agree with thine adversary quickly, whiles thou art in the way with him; lest at any time the adversary deliver thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and thou be cast into prison.
- 26. Verily I say unto thee, Thou shalt by no means come out thence, till thou hast paid the uttermost farthing.
- 27. Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery:
- 28. But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.
- 29. And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.
- 30. And if thy right hand offend thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.
- 31. It hath been said, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement:
- 32. But I say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery.
- 33. Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths:
- 34. But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:
- 35. Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King.
- 36. Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black.
- 37. But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.
- 38. Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth:
- 39. But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.
- 40. And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloak also.
- 41. And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain.
- 42. Give to him that asketh thee, and from him that would borrow of thee turn not thou away.
- 43. Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy.
- 44. But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;
- 45. That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.
- 46. For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same?
- 47. And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so?
- 48. Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.

- 20. And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said, Blessed be ye poor: for yours is the kingdom of God.
- 21. Blessed are ye that hunger now: for ye shall be filled. Blessed are ye that weep now: for ye shall laugh.
- 22. Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall reproach you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.
- 23. Rejoice ye in that day, and leap for joy: for, behold, your reward is great in heaven: for in the like manner did their fathers unto the prophets.
- 24. But woe unto you that are rich! for ye have received your consolation.
- 25. Woe unto you that are full! for ye shall hunger. Woe unto you that laugh now! for ye shall mourn and weep.
- 26. Woe unto you, when all men shall speak well of you! for so did their fathers to the false prophets.
- 27. But I say unto you which hear, Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you,
- 28. Bless them that curse you, and pray for them which despitefully use you.
- 29. And unto him that smiteth thee on the one cheek offer also the other; and him that taketh away thy cloak forbid not to take thy coat also.
- 30. Give to every man that asketh of thee; and of him that taketh away thy goods ask them not again.
- 31. And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise.
- 32. For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye? for sinners also love those that love them.
- 33. And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what thank have ye? for sinners also do even the same.
- 34. And if ye lend to them of whom ye hope to receive, what thank have ye? for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again.
- 35. But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil.
- 36. Be ye therefore merciful, as your Father also is merciful.
- 37. Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven:
- 38. Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.
- 39. And he spake a parable unto them, Can the blind lead the blind? shall they not both fall into the ditch?
- 40. The disciple is not above his master: but every one that is perfect shall be as his master.
- 41. And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but perceivest not the beam that is in thine own eye?
- 42. Either how canst thou say to thy brother, Brother, let me pull out the mote that is in thine eye, when thou thyself beholdest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine own eye, and then shalt thou see clearly to pull out the mote that is in thy brother's eye.
- 43. For a good tree bringeth not forth corrupt fruit; neither doth a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.
- 44. For every tree is known by his own fruit. For of thorns men do not gather figs, nor of a bramble bush gather they grapes.
- 45. A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil: for of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaketh.
- 46. And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?
- 47. Whosoever cometh to me, and heareth my sayings, and doeth them, I will shew you to whom he is like:

- 48. He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock.
- 49. But he that heareth, and doeth not, is like a man that without a foundation built an house upon the earth; against which the stream did beat vehemently, and immediately it fell; and the ruin of that house was great.

c. Mt 6:1-34 Sermon B

- 1. Take heed that ye do not your alms before men, to be seen of them: otherwise ye have no reward of your Father which is in heaven.
- 2. Therefore when thou doest thine alms, do not sound a trumpet before thee, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.
- 3. But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth:
- 4. That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward thee openly.
- 5. And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.
- 6. But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.
- 7. But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking.
- 8. Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him.
- 9. After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name.
- 10. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.
- 11. Give us this day our daily bread.
- 12. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.
- 13. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.
- 14. For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you:
- 15. But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.
- 16. Moreover when ye fast, be not, as the hypocrites, of a sad countenance: for they disfigure their faces, that they may appear unto men to fast. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.
- 17. But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face;
- 18. That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly.
- 19. Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal:
- 20. But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal:
- 21. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.
- 22. The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light.
- 23. But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!
- 24. No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

- 25. Therefore I say unto you, Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment?
- 26. Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?
- 27. Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his stature?
- 28. And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin:
- 29. And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.
- 30. Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith?
- 31. Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed?
- 32. (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things.
- 33. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.
- 34. Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

d. Mt 7:1-29 Sermon C

- 1. Judge not, that ye be not judged.
- 2. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again.
- 3. And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?
- 4. Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye?
- 5. Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye.
- 6. Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you.
- 7. Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ve shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you:
- 8. For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.
- 9. Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone?
- 10. Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent?
- 11. If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?
- 12. Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.
- 13. Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat:
- 14. Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.
- 15. Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.
- 16. Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles?
- 17. Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit.
- 18. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.

- 19. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.
- 20. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.
- 21. Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.
- 22. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?
- 23. And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.
- 24. Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:
- 25. And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock.
- 26. And every one that heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand:
- 27. And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall of it.
- 28. And it came to pass, when Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine:
- 29. For he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

a. Mt 8:5-13 Caper.Cent.Servant

- 5. And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him,
- 6. And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented.
- 7. And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him.
- 8. The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed.

- 11. And it came to pass the day after, that he went into a city called Nain; and many of his disciples went with him, and much people.
- 12. Now when he came nigh to the gate of the city, behold, there was a dead man carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow: and much people of the city was with her.

- 9. But what went ye out for to see? A prophet? yea, I say unto you, and more than a prophet.
- 10. For this is he, of whom it is written, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee.

- 11. Verily I say unto you, Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist: notwithstanding he that is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.
- 12. And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force.
- 13. For all the prophets and the law prophesied until John.
- 14. And if ye will receive it, this is Elias, which was for to come.
- 15. He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- 16. But whereunto shall I liken this generation? It is like unto children sitting in the markets, and calling unto their fellows,
- 17. And saying, We have piped unto you, and ye have not danced; we have mourned unto you, and ye have not lamented.
- 18. For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, He hath a devil.
- 19. The Son of man came eating and drinking, and they say, Behold a man gluttonous, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners. But wisdom is justified of her children.

Lu 7:18-35 ?John

- 18. And the disciples of John shewed him of all these things.
- 19. And John calling unto him two of his disciples sent them to Jesus, saying, Art thou he that should come? or look we for another?
- 20. When the men were come unto him, they said, John Baptist hath sent us unto thee, saying, Art thou he that should come? or look we for another?
- 21. And in that same hour he cured many of their infirmities and plagues, and of evil spirits; and unto many that were blind he gave sight.

- 27. This is he, of whom it is written, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee.
- 28. For I say unto you, Among those that are born of women there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist: but he that is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he.
- 29. And all the people that heard him, and the publicans, justified God, being baptized with the baptism of John.
- 30. But the Pharisees and lawyers rejected the counsel of God against themselves, being not baptized of him.
- 31. And the Lord said, Whereunto then shall I liken the men of this generation? and to what are they like?

- 32. They are like unto children sitting in the marketplace, and calling one to another, and saying, We have piped unto you, and ye have not danced; we have mourned to you, and ye have not wept.
- 33. For John the Baptist came neither eating bread nor drinking wine; and ye say, He hath a devil.
- 34. The Son of man is come eating and drinking; and ye say, Behold a gluttonous man, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners!
- 35. But wisdom is justified of all her children.

d. Mt 11:20-24 ?Sodom

- 20. Then began he to upbraid the cities wherein most of his mighty works were done, because they repented not:
- 21. Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works, which were done in you, had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes.
- 22. But I say unto you, It shall be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the day of judgment, than for you.
- 23. And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted unto heaven, shalt be brought down to hell: for if the mighty works, which have been done in thee, had been done in Sodom, it would have remained until this day.
- 24. But I say unto you, That it shall be more tolerable for the land of Sodom in the day of judgment, than for thee.

Lu 10:12-16 ?Sodom

- 12. But I say unto you, that it shall be more tolerable in that day for Sodom, than for that city.
- 13. Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works had been done in Tyre and Sidon, which have been done in you, they had a great while ago repented, sitting in sackcloth and ashes.
- 14. But it shall be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment, than for you.
- 15. And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted to heaven, shalt be thrust down to hell.
- 16. He that heareth you heareth me; and he that despiseth you despiseth me; and he that despiseth me despiseth him that sent me.

e. Mt 11:25-30 MyYoke

- 25. At that time Jesus answered and said, I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes.
- 26. Even so, Father: for so it seemed good in thy sight.
- 27. All things are delivered unto me of my Father: and no man knoweth the Son, but the Father; neither knoweth any man the Father, save the Son, and he to whomsoever the Son will reveal him.
- 28. Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.
- 29. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.
- 30. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

21. SimonThePharisee-WashTears-WipeHair / WomenSupporting

a. Lu 7:36-50 SimonThePharisee-WashTears-WipeHair

- 36. And one of the Pharisees desired him that he would eat with him. And he went into the Pharisee's house, and sat down to meat.
- 37. And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment,
- 38. And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.
- 39. Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner.
- 40. And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on.
- 41. There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.
- 42. And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?
- 43. Simon answered and said, I suppose that he, to whom he forgave most. And he said unto him, Thou hast rightly judged.
- 44. And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head.
- 45. Thou gavest me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss my feet.
- 46. My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment.
- 47. Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little.
- 48. And he said unto her, Thy sins are forgiven.
- 49. And they that sat at meat with him began to say within themselves, Who is this that forgiveth sins also?
- 50. And he said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace.

b. Lu 8:1-3 WomenSupporting

- 1. And it came to pass afterward, that he went throughout every city and village, preaching and shewing the glad tidings of the kingdom of God: and the twelve were with him,
- 2. And certain women, which had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary called Magdalene, out of whom went seven devils,

22. Beelzebub-BlasphemeSpirit / NoSignButJonah's / WhoIsJesus'Family?

a. Mt 12:22-37 Beelzebub-BlasphemeSpirit

- 22. Then was brought unto him one possessed with a devil, blind, and dumb: and he healed him, insomuch that the blind and dumb both spake and saw.
- 23. And all the people were amazed, and said, Is not this the son of David?
- 24. But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of the devils.
- 25. And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand:
- 26. And if Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself; how shall then his kingdom stand?
- 27. And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your children cast them out? therefore they shall be your judges.
- 28. But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come unto you.
- 29. Or else how can one enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he first bind the strong man? and then he will spoil his house.
- 30. He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad.
- 31. Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men.
- 32. And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come.
- 33. Either make the tree good, and his fruit good; or else make the tree corrupt, and his fruit corrupt: for the tree is known by his fruit.
- 34. O generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things? for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh.
- 35. A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things.
- 36. But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment.
- 37. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.

Mk 3:22-30 Beelzebub-BlasphemeSpirit

- 22. And the scribes which came down from Jerusalem said, He hath Beelzebub, and by the prince of the devils casteth he out devils.
- 23. And he called them unto him, and said unto them in parables, How can Satan cast out Satan?
- 24. And if a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.
- 25. And if a house be divided against itself, that house cannot stand.
- 26. And if Satan rise up against himself, and be divided, he cannot stand, but hath an end.
- 27. No man can enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he will first bind the strong man; and then he will spoil his house.
- 28. Verily I say unto you, All sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme:
- 29. But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation:

30. Because they said, He hath an unclean spirit.

Lu 11:14-28 Beelzebub-BlasphemeSpirit (multiple occurrence or Matthew sequence)

- 14. And he was casting out a devil, and it was dumb. And it came to pass, when the devil was gone out, the dumb spake; and the people wondered.
- 15. But some of them said, He casteth out devils through Beelzebub the chief of the devils.
- 16. And others, tempting him, sought of him a sign from heaven.
- 17. But he, knowing their thoughts, said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house divided against a house falleth.
- 18. If Satan also be divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? because ye say that I cast out devils through Beelzebub.
- 19. And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your sons cast them out? therefore shall they be your judges.
- 20. But if I with the finger of God cast out devils, no doubt the kingdom of God is come upon you.
- 21. When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace:
- 22. But when a stronger than he shall come upon him, and overcome him, he taketh from him all his armour wherein he trusted, and divideth his spoils.
- 23. He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth.
- 24. When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out.
- 25. And when he cometh, he findeth it swept and garnished.
- 26. Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.
- 27. And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked.
- 28. But he said, Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.

b. Mt 12:38-45 NoSignButJonah's

- 38. Then certain of the scribes and of the Pharisees answered, saying, Master, we would see a sign from thee.
- 39. But he answered and said unto them, An evil and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas:
- 40. For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.
- 41. The men of Nineveh shall rise in judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: because they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here.
- 42. The queen of the south shall rise up in the judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: for she came from the uttermost parts of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and, behold, a greater than Solomon is here.
- 43. When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest, and findeth
- 44. Then he saith, I will return into my house from whence I came out; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished.

45. Then goeth he, and taketh with himself seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first. Even so shall it be also unto this wicked generation.

Lu 11:29-36 NoSignButJonah's (multiple occurrence or Matthew sequence)

- 29. And when the people were gathered thick together, he began to say, This is an evil generation: they seek a sign; and there shall no sign be given it, but the sign of Jonas the prophet.
- 30. For as Jonas was a sign unto the Ninevites, so shall also the Son of man be to this generation.
- 31. The queen of the south shall rise up in the judgment with the men of this generation, and condemn them: for she came from the utmost parts of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and, behold, a greater than Solomon is here.
- 32. The men of Nineve shall rise up in the judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: for they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here.
- 33. No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light.
- 34. The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is single, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness.
- 35. Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness.
- 36. If thy whole body therefore be full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a candle doth give thee light.

c. Mt 12:46-50 WhoIsJesus'Family?

- 46. While he yet talked to the people, behold, his mother and his brethren stood without, desiring to speak with him.
- 47. Then one said unto him, Behold, thy mother and thy brethren stand without, desiring to speak with thee.
- 48. But he answered and said unto him that told him, Who is my mother? and who are my brethren?
- 49. And he stretched forth his hand toward his disciples, and said, Behold my mother and my brethren!
- 50. For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother.

Mk 3:31-35 WhoIsJesus'Family?

- 31. There came then his brethren and his mother, and, standing without, sent unto him, calling him.
- 32. And the multitude sat about him, and they said unto him, Behold, thy mother and thy brethren without seek for thee.
- 33. And he answered them, saying, Who is my mother, or my brethren?
- 34. And he looked round about on them which sat about him, and said, Behold my mother and my brethren!
- 35. For whosoever shall do the will of God, the same is my brother, and my sister, and mother.

Lu 8:19-21 WhoIsJesus'Family?

- 19. Then came to him his mother and his brethren, and could not come at him for the press.
- 20. And it was told him by certain which said, Thy mother and thy brethren stand without, desiring to see thee.
- 21. And he answered and said unto them, My mother and my brethren are these which hear the word of God, and do it.

23. SeedWeedKingdom / Pearl-Gnashing / DeadBury / Storm / Gadarenes

a. Mt 13:1-37 SeedWeedKingdom

- 1. The same day went Jesus out of the house, and sat by the sea side.
- 2. And great multitudes were gathered together unto him, so that he went into a ship, and sat; and the whole multitude stood on the shore.
- 3. And he spake many things unto them in parables, saying, Behold, a sower went forth to sow;
- 4. And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the way side, and the fowls came and devoured them up:
- 5. Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much earth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth:
- 6. And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.
- 7. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them:
- 8. But other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold.
- 9. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- 10. And the disciples came, and said unto him, Why speakest thou unto them in parables?
- 11. He answered and said unto them, Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given.
- 12. For whosoever hath, to him shall be given, and he shall have more abundance: but whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken away even that he hath.
- 13. Therefore speak I to them in parables: because they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand.
- 14. And in them is fulfilled the prophecy of Esaias, which saith, By hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and shall not perceive:
- 15. For this people's heart is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes they have closed; lest at any time they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them.
- 16. But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear.
- 17. For verily I say unto you, That many prophets and righteous men have desired to see those things which ye see, and have not seen them; and to hear those things which ye hear, and have not heard them.
- 18. Hear ye therefore the parable of the sower.
- 19. When any one heareth the word of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the way side.
- 20. But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it;
- 21. Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended.
- 22. He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful.
- 23. But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the word, and understandeth it; which also beareth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.
- 24. Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good seed in his field:
- 25. But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way.

- 26. But when the blade was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares also.
- 27. So the servants of the householder came and said unto him, Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? from whence then hath it tares?
- 28. He said unto them, An enemy hath done this. The servants said unto him, Wilt thou then that we go and gather them up?
- 29. But he said, Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, ye root up also the wheat with them.
- 30. Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn.
- 31. Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field:
- 32. Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof.
- 33. Another parable spake he unto them; The kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened.
- 34. All these things spake Jesus unto the multitude in parables; and without a parable spake he not unto them:
- 35. That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter things which have been kept secret from the foundation of the world.
- 36. Then Jesus sent the multitude away, and went into the house: and his disciples came unto him, saying, Declare unto us the parable of the tares of the field.
- 37. He answered and said unto them, He that soweth the good seed is the Son of man;

Mk 4:1-34 SeedWeedKingdom

- 1. And he began again to teach by the sea side: and there was gathered unto him a great multitude, so that he entered into a ship, and sat in the sea; and the whole multitude was by the sea on the land.
- 2. And he taught them many things by parables, and said unto them in his doctrine,
- 3. Hearken; Behold, there went out a sower to sow:
- 4. And it came to pass, as he sowed, some fell by the way side, and the fowls of the air came and devoured it up.
- 5. And some fell on stony ground, where it had not much earth; and immediately it sprang up, because it had no depth of earth:
- 6. But when the sun was up, it was scorched; and because it had no root, it withered away.
- 7. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up, and choked it, and it yielded no fruit.
- 8. And other fell on good ground, and did yield fruit that sprang up and increased; and brought forth, some thirty, and some sixty, and some an hundred.
- 9. And he said unto them, He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- 10. And when he was alone, they that were about him with the twelve asked of him the parable.
- 11. And he said unto them, Unto you it is given to know the mystery of the kingdom of God: but unto them that are without, all these things are done in parables:
- 12. That seeing they may see, and not perceive; and hearing they may hear, and not understand; lest at any time they should be converted, and their sins should be forgiven them.
- 13. And he said unto them, Know ve not this parable? and how then will ye know all parables?
- 14. The sower soweth the word.

- 15. And these are they by the way side, where the word is sown; but when they have heard, Satan cometh immediately, and taketh away the word that was sown in their hearts.
- 16. And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness;
- 17. And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth for the word's sake, immediately they are offended.
- 18. And these are they which are sown among thorns; such as hear the word,
- 19. And the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things entering in, choke the word, and it becometh unfruitful.
- 20. And these are they which are sown on good ground; such as hear the word, and receive it, and bring forth fruit, some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some an hundred.
- 21. And he said unto them, Is a candle brought to be put under a bushel, or under a bed? and not to be set on a candlestick?
- 22. For there is nothing hid, which shall not be manifested; neither was any thing kept secret, but that it should come abroad.
- 23. If any man have ears to hear, let him hear.
- 24. And he said unto them, Take heed what ye hear: with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you: and unto you that hear shall more be given.
- 25. For he that hath, to him shall be given: and he that hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he hath.
- 26. And he said, So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground;
- 27. And should sleep, and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up, he knoweth not how.
- 28. For the earth bringeth forth fruit of herself; first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear.
- 29. But when the fruit is brought forth, immediately he putteth in the sickle, because the harvest is come.
- 30. And he said, Whereunto shall we liken the kingdom of God? or with what comparison shall we compare it?
- 31. It is like a grain of mustard seed, which, when it is sown in the earth, is less than all the seeds that be in the earth:
- 32. But when it is sown, it groweth up, and becometh greater than all herbs, and shooteth out great branches; so that the fowls of the air may lodge under the shadow of it.
- 33. And with many such parables spake he the word unto them, as they were able to hear it.
- 34. But without a parable spake he not unto them: and when they were alone, he expounded all things to his disciples.

Lu 8:4-18 SeedWeedKingdom

- 4. And when much people were gathered together, and were come to him out of every city, he spake by a parable:
- 5. A sower went out to sow his seed: and as he sowed, some fell by the way side; and it was trodden down, and the fowls of the air devoured it.
- 6. And some fell upon a rock; and as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away, because it lacked moisture.
- 7. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprang up with it, and choked it.
- 8. And other fell on good ground, and sprang up, and bare fruit an hundredfold. And when he had said these things, he cried, He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- 9. And his disciples asked him, saying, What might this parable be?
- 10. And he said, Unto you it is given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God: but to others in parables; that seeing they might not see, and hearing they might not understand.

- 11. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.
- 12. Those by the way side are they that hear; then cometh the devil, and taketh away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved.
- 13. They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away.
- 14. And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection.
- 15. But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience.
- 16. No man, when he hath lighted a candle, covereth it with a vessel, or putteth it under a bed; but setteth it on a candlestick, that they which enter in may see the light.
- 17. For nothing is secret, that shall not be made manifest; neither any thing hid, that shall not be known and come abroad.
- 18. Take heed therefore how ye hear: for whosoever hath, to him shall be given; and whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seemeth to have.

b. Mt 13:38-53 Pearl-Gnashing

- 38. The field is the world; the good seed are the children of the kingdom; but the tares are the children of the wicked one;
- 39. The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels.
- 40. As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fire; so shall it be in the end of this world.
- 41. The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity;
- 42. And shall cast them into a furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.
- 43. Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- 44. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field.
- 45. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls:
- 46. Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it.
- 47. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a net, that was cast into the sea, and gathered of every kind:
- 48. Which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and sat down, and gathered the good into vessels, but cast the bad away.
- 49. So shall it be at the end of the world: the angels shall come forth, and sever the wicked from among the just,
- 50. And shall cast them into the furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.
- 51. Jesus saith unto them, Have ye understood all these things? They say unto him, Yea, Lord.
- 52. Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old.
- 53. And it came to pass, that when Jesus had finished these parables, he departed thence.

c. Mt 8:18-22 DeadBury

18. Now when Jesus saw great multitudes about him, he gave commandment to depart unto the other side.

- 19. And a certain scribe came, and said unto him, Master, I will follow thee whithersoever thou goest.
- 20. And Jesus saith unto him, The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head.
- 21. And another of his disciples said unto him, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father.
- 22. But Jesus said unto him, Follow me; and let the dead bury their dead.

d. Mt 8:23-27 Storm

- 23. And when he was entered into a ship, his disciples followed him.
- 24. And, behold, there arose a great tempest in the sea, insomuch that the ship was covered with the waves: but he was asleep.
- 25. And his disciples came to him, and awoke him, saying, Lord, save us: we perish.
- 26. And he saith unto them, Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then he arose, and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a great calm.
- 27. But the men marvelled, saying, What manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey him!

Mk 4:35-41 Storm

- 35. And the same day, when the even was come, he saith unto them, Let us pass over unto the other side.
- 36. And when they had sent away the multitude, they took him even as he was in the ship. And there were also with him other little ships.
- 37. And there arose a great storm of wind, and the waves beat into the ship, so that it was now full.
- 38. And he was in the hinder part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake him, and say unto him, Master, carest thou not that we perish?
- 39. And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.
- 40. And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?
- 41. And they feared exceedingly, and said one to another, What manner of man is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?

Lu 8:22-25 Storm

- 22. Now it came to pass on a certain day, that he went into a ship with his disciples: and he said unto them, Let us go over unto the other side of the lake. And they launched forth.
- 23. But as they sailed he fell asleep: and there came down a storm of wind on the lake; and they were filled with water, and were in jeopardy.
- 24. And they came to him, and awoke him, saying, Master, master, we perish. Then he arose, and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water: and they ceased, and there was a calm.
- 25. And he said unto them, Where is your faith? And they being afraid wondered, saying one to another, What manner of man is this! for he commandeth even the winds and water, and they obey him.

e. Mt 8:28-34 Gadarenes

28. And when he was come to the other side into the country of the Gergesenes, there met him two possessed with devils, coming out of the tombs, exceeding fierce, so that no man might pass by that way.

- 29. And, behold, they cried out, saying, What have we to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God? art thou come hither to torment us before the time?
- 30. And there was a good way off from them an herd of many swine feeding.
- 31. So the devils besought him, saying, If thou cast us out, suffer us to go away into the herd of swine.
- 32. And he said unto them, Go. And when they were come out, they went into the herd of swine: and, behold, the whole herd of swine ran violently down a steep place into the sea, and perished in the waters.
- 33. And they that kept them fled, and went their ways into the city, and told every thing, and what was befallen to the possessed of the devils.
- 34. And, behold, the whole city came out to meet Jesus: and when they saw him, they besought him that he would depart out of their coasts.

Mk 5:1-21 Gadarenes

- 1. And they came over unto the other side of the sea, into the country of the Gadarenes.
- 2. And when he was come out of the ship, immediately there met him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit,
- 3. Who had his dwelling among the tombs; and no man could bind him, no, not with chains:
- 4. Because that he had been often bound with fetters and chains, and the chains had been plucked asunder by him, and the fetters broken in pieces: neither could any man tame him.
- 5. And always, night and day, he was in the mountains, and in the tombs, crying, and cutting himself with stones.
- 6. But when he saw Jesus afar off, he ran and worshipped him,
- 7. And cried with a loud voice, and said, What have I to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of the most high God? I adjure thee by God, that thou torment me not.
- 8. For he said unto him, Come out of the man, thou unclean spirit.
- 9. And he asked him, What is thy name? And he answered, saying, My name is Legion: for we are many.
- 10. And he besought him much that he would not send them away out of the country.
- 11. Now there was there nigh unto the mountains a great herd of swine feeding.
- 12. And all the devils besought him, saying, Send us into the swine, that we may enter into them.
- 13. And forthwith Jesus gave them leave. And the unclean spirits went out, and entered into the swine: and the herd ran violently down a steep place into the sea, (they were about two thousand;) and were choked in the sea.
- 14. And they that fed the swine fled, and told it in the city, and in the country. And they went out to see what it was that was done.
- 15. And they come to Jesus, and see him that was possessed with the devil, and had the legion, sitting, and clothed, and in his right mind: and they were afraid.
- 16. And they that saw it told them how it befell to him that was possessed with the devil, and also concerning the swine.
- 17. And they began to pray him to depart out of their coasts.
- 18. And when he was come into the ship, he that had been possessed with the devil prayed him that he might be with him.
- 19. Howbeit Jesus suffered him not, but saith unto him, Go home to thy friends, and tell them how great things the Lord hath done for thee, and hath had compassion on thee.
- 20. And he departed, and began to publish in Decapolis how great things Jesus had done for him: and all men did marvel.
- 21. And when Jesus was passed over again by ship unto the other side, much people gathered unto him: and he was nigh unto the sea.

Lu 8:26-40 Gadarenes

- 26. And they arrived at the country of the Gadarenes, which is over against Galilee.
- 27. And when he went forth to land, there met him out of the city a certain man, which had devils long time, and ware no clothes, neither abode in any house, but in the tombs.
- 28. When he saw Jesus, he cried out, and fell down before him, and with a loud voice said, What have I to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God most high? I beseech thee, torment me not.
- 29. (For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For oftentimes it had caught him: and he was kept bound with chains and in fetters; and he brake the bands, and was driven of the devil into the wilderness.)
- 30. And Jesus asked him, saying, What is thy name? And he said, Legion: because many devils were entered into him.
- 31. And they be sought him that he would not command them to go out into the deep.
- 32. And there was there an herd of many swine feeding on the mountain: and they besought him that he would suffer them to enter into them. And he suffered them.
- 33. Then went the devils out of the man, and entered into the swine: and the herd ran violently down a steep place into the lake, and were choked.
- 34. When they that fed them saw what was done, they fled, and went and told it in the city and in the country.
- 35. Then they went out to see what was done; and came to Jesus, and found the man, out of whom the devils were departed, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed, and in his right mind: and they were afraid.
- 36. They also which saw it told them by what means he that was possessed of the devils was healed.
- 37. Then the whole multitude of the country of the Gadarenes round about besought him to depart from them; for they were taken with great fear: and he went up into the ship, and returned back again.
- 38. Now the man out of whom the devils were departed besought him that he might be with him: but Jesus sent him away, saying,
- 39. Return to thine own house, and shew how great things God hath done unto thee. And he went his way, and published throughout the whole city how great things Jesus had done unto him.
- 40. And it came to pass, that, when Jesus was returned, the people gladly received him: for they were all waiting for him.

a. Mt 9:18-26 Jairus'-HemOfGarment

- 18. While he spake these things unto them, behold, there came a certain ruler, and worshipped him, saying, My daughter is even now dead: but come and lay thy hand upon her, and she shall live.
- 19. And Jesus arose, and followed him, and so did his disciples.
- 20. And, behold, a woman, which was diseased with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind him, and touched the hem of his garment:
- 21. For she said within herself, If I may but touch his garment, I shall be whole.
- 22. But Jesus turned him about, and when he saw her, he said, Daughter, be of good comfort; thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour.

- 23. And when Jesus came into the ruler's house, and saw the minstrels and the people making a noise,
- 24. He said unto them, Give place: for the maid is not dead, but sleepeth. And they laughed him to scorn.
- 25. But when the people were put forth, he went in, and took her by the hand, and the maid arose.
- 26. And the fame hereof went abroad into all that land.

Mk 5:22-43 Jairus'-HemOfGarment

- 22. And, behold, there cometh one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name; and when he saw him, he fell at his feet,
- 23. And besought him greatly, saying, My little daughter lieth at the point of death: I pray thee, come and lay thy hands on her, that she may be healed; and she shall live.
- 24. And Jesus went with him; and much people followed him, and thronged him.
- 25. And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years,
- 26. And had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse,

- 33. But the woman fearing and trembling, knowing what was done in her, came and fell down before him, and told him all the truth.
- 34. And he said unto her, Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace, and be whole of thy plague.
- 35. While he yet spake, there came from the ruler of the synagogue's house certain which said, Thy daughter is dead: why troublest thou the Master any further?
- 36. As soon as Jesus heard the word that was spoken, he saith unto the ruler of the synagogue, Be not afraid, only believe.
- 37. And he suffered no man to follow him, save Peter, and James, and John the brother of James. the ruler of the synagogue, and seeth the tumult, and them that wept and wailed greatly.
- 39. And when he was come in, he saith unto them, Why make ye this ado, and weep? the damsel is not dead, but sleepeth.
- 40. And they laughed him to scorn. But when he had put them all out, he taketh the father and the mother of the damsel, and them that were with him, and entereth in where the damsel was lying.
- 41. And he took the damsel by the hand, and said unto her, Talitha cumi; which is, being interpreted, Damsel, I say unto thee, arise.
- 42. And straightway the damsel arose, and walked; for she was of the age of twelve years. And they were astonished with a great astonishment.
- 43. And he charged them straitly that no man should know it; and commanded that something should be given her to eat.

- 41. And, behold, there came a man named Jairus, and he was a ruler of the synagogue: and he fell down at Jesus' feet, and besought him that he would come into his house:
- 42. For he had one only daughter, about twelve years of age, and she lay a dying. But as he went the people throughd him.
- 43. And a woman having an issue of blood twelve years, which had spent all her living upon physicians, neither could be healed of any,
- 44. Came behind him, and touched the border of his garment: and immediately her issue of blood stanched.
- 45. And Jesus said, Who touched me? When all denied, Peter and they that were with him said, Master, the multitude throng thee and press thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me?
- 46. And Jesus said, Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me.
- 47. And when the woman saw that she was not hid, she came trembling, and falling down before him, she declared unto him before all the people for what cause she had touched him and how she was healed immediately.
- 48. And he said unto her, Daughter, be of good comfort: thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace.
- 49. While he yet spake, there cometh one from the ruler of the synagogue's house, saying to him, Thy daughter is dead; trouble not the Master.
- 50. But when Jesus heard it, he answered him, saying, Fear not: believe only, and she shall be made whole.
- 51. And when he came into the house, he suffered no man to go in, save Peter, and James, and John, and the father and the mother of the maiden.
- 52. And all wept, and bewailed her: but he said, Weep not; she is not dead, but sleepeth.
- 53. And they laughed him to scorn, knowing that she was dead.
- 54. And he put them all out, and took her by the hand, and called, saying, Maid, arise.
- 55. And her spirit came again, and she arose straightway: and he commanded to give her meat.
- 56. And her parents were astonished: but he charged them that they should tell no man what was done.

b. Mt 9:27-34 BlindMute

- 27. And when Jesus departed thence, two blind men followed him, crying, and saying, Thou Son of David, have mercy on us.
- 28. And when he was come into the house, the blind men came to him: and Jesus saith unto them, Believe ye that I am able to do this? They said unto him, Yea, Lord.

c. Mt 13:54-58 Carpenter?-HisSiblings?

54. And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, insomuch that they were astonished, and said, Whence hath this man this wisdom, and these mighty works?

- 55. Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James, and Joses, and Simon, and Judas?
- 56. And his sisters, are they not all with us? Whence then hath this man all these things?
- 57. And they were offended in him. But Jesus said unto them, A prophet is not without honour, save in his own country, and in his own house.
- 58. And he did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief.

Mk 6:1-6 Carpenter?-HisSiblings?

- 1. And he went out from thence, and came into his own country; and his disciples follow him.
- 2. And when the sabbath day was come, he began to teach in the synagogue: and many hearing him were astonished, saying, From whence hath this man these things? and what wisdom is this which is given unto him, that even such mighty works are wrought by his hands?
- 3. Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, and Joses, and of Juda, and Simon? and are not his sisters here with us? And they were offended at him.
- 4. But Jesus, said unto them, A prophet is not without honour, but in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house.
- 5. And he could there do no mighty work, save that he laid his hands upon a few sick folk, and healed them.
- 6. And he marvelled because of their unbelief. And he went round about the villages, teaching.

25. LaborersAreFew / DisciplesSentOut2x2 / Jesus(-12)ForATime

a. Mt 9:35-38 LaborersAreFew

- 35. And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people.
- 36. But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd.
- 37. Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few;
- 38. Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest.

b. Mt 10:1-42 DisciplesSentOut2x2

- 1. And when he had called unto him his twelve disciples, he gave them power against unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease.
- 2. Now the names of the twelve apostles are these; The first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother;

- 12. And when ye come into an house, salute it.
- 13. And if the house be worthy, let your peace come upon it: but if it be not worthy, let your peace return to vou.
- 14. And whosoever shall not receive you, nor hear your words, when ye depart out of that house or city, shake off the dust of your feet.
- 15. Verily I say unto you, It shall be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrha in the day of judgment, than for that city.
- 16. Behold, I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves: be ye therefore wise as serpents, and harmless as doves.
- 17. But beware of men: for they will deliver you up to the councils, and they will scourge you in their synagogues;
- 18. And ye shall be brought before governors and kings for my sake, for a testimony against them and the Gentiles.
- 19. But when they deliver you up, take no thought how or what ye shall speak: for it shall be given you in that same hour what ye shall speak.
- 20. For it is not ye that speak, but the Spirit of your Father which speaketh in you.
- 21. And the brother shall deliver up the brother to death, and the father the child: and the children shall rise up against their parents, and cause them to be put to death.
- 22. And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: but he that endureth to the end shall be saved.
- 23. But when they persecute you in this city, flee ye into another: for verily I say unto you, Ye shall not have gone over the cities of Israel, till the Son of man be come.
- 24. The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant above his lord.
- 25. It is enough for the disciple that he be as his master, and the servant as his lord. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebub, how much more shall they call them of his household?
- 26. Fear them not therefore: for there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; and hid, that shall not be known.
- 27. What I tell you in darkness, that speak ye in light: and what ye hear in the ear, that preach ye upon the housetops.
- 28. And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.
- 29. Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? and one of them shall not fall on the ground without your Father.
- 30. But the very hairs of your head are all numbered.
- 31. Fear ve not therefore, ye are of more value than many sparrows.
- 32. Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven.
- 33. But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven.
- 34. Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I came not to send peace, but a sword.
- 35. For I am come to set a man at variance against his father, and the daughter against her mother, and the daughter in law against her mother in law.
- 36. And a man's foes shall be they of his own household.

- 37. He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.
- 38. And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me.
- 39. He that findeth his life shall lose it: and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it.
- 40. He that receiveth you receiveth me, and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me.
- 41. He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward; and he that receiveth a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward.
- 42. And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward.

Mk 6:7-13 DisciplesSentOut2x2

- 7. And he called unto him the twelve, and began to send them forth by two and two; and gave them power over unclean spirits;
- 8. And commanded them that they should take nothing for their journey, save a staff only; no scrip, no bread, no money in their purse:
- 9. But be shod with sandals; and not put on two coats.
- 10. And he said unto them, In what place soever ye enter into an house, there abide till ye depart from that place.

- 3. For Herod had laid hold on John, and bound him, and put him in prison for Herodias' sake, his brother Philip's wife.
- 4. For John said unto him, It is not lawful for thee to have her.
- 5. And when he would have put him to death, he feared the multitude, because they counted him as a prophet.
- 6. But when Herod's birthday was kept, the daughter of Herodias danced before them, and pleased Herod.
- 7. Whereupon he promised with an oath to give her whatsoever she would ask.
- 8. And she, being before instructed of her mother, said, Give me here John Baptist's head in a charger.
- 9. And the king was sorry: nevertheless for the oath's sake, and them which sat with him at meat, he commanded it to be given her.
- 10. And he sent, and beheaded John in the prison.
- 11. And his head was brought in a charger, and given to the damsel: and she brought it to her mother.
- 12. And his disciples came, and took up the body, and buried it, and went and told Jesus.

Mk 6:14-29 Herod II Curious-JohnDead

- 14. And king Herod heard of him; (for his name was spread abroad:) and he said, That John the Baptist was risen from the dead, and therefore mighty works do shew forth themselves in him.
- 15. Others said, That it is Elias. And others said, That it is a prophet, or as one of the prophets.
- 16. But when Herod heard thereof, he said, It is John, whom I beheaded: he is risen from the dead.
- 17. For Herod himself had sent forth and laid hold upon John, and bound him in prison for Herodias' sake, his brother Philip's wife: for he had married her.
- 18. For John had said unto Herod, It is not lawful for thee to have thy brother's wife.
- 19. Therefore Herodias had a quarrel against him, and would have killed him; but she could not:
- 20. For Herod feared John, knowing that he was a just man and an holy, and observed him; and when he heard him, he did many things, and heard him gladly.
- 21. And when a convenient day was come, that Herod on his birthday made a supper to his lords, high captains, and chief estates of Galilee;
- 22. And when the daughter of the said Herodias came in, and danced, and pleased Herod and them that sat with him, the king said unto the damsel, Ask of me whatsoever thou wilt, and I will give it thee.
- 23. And he sware unto her, Whatsoever thou shalt ask of me, I will give it thee, unto the half of my kingdom.
- 24. And she went forth, and said unto her mother, What shall I ask? And she said, The head of John the Baptist.
- 25. And she came in straightway with haste unto the king, and asked, saying, I will that thou give me by and by in a charger the head of John the Baptist.
- 26. And the king was exceeding sorry; yet for his oath's sake, and for their sakes which sat with him, he would not reject her.
- 27. And immediately the king sent an executioner, and commanded his head to be brought: and he went and beheaded him in the prison,
- 28. And brought his head in a charger, and gave it to the damsel: and the damsel gave it to her mother.

29. And when his disciples heard of it, they came and took up his corpse, and laid it in a tomb.

Lu 9:7-9 Herod II Curious-John Dead

- 7. Now Herod the tetrarch heard of all that was done by him: and he was perplexed, because that it was said of some, that John was risen from the dead;
- 8. And of some, that Elias had appeared; and of others, that one of the old prophets was risen again.
- 9. And Herod said, John have I beheaded: but who is this, of whom I hear such things? And he desired to see him.

b. Mk 6:30 12 Return-Tales

- 14. And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick.

Mk 6:31-34 BethsaidaRest?

- 31. And he said unto them, Come ye yourselves apart into a desert place, and rest a while: for there were many coming and going, and they had no leisure so much as to eat.
- 32. And they departed into a desert place by ship privately.
- 33. And the people saw them departing, and many knew him, and ran afoot thither out of all cities, and outwent them, and came together unto him.
- 34. And Jesus, when he came out, saw much people, and was moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd: and he began to teach them many things.

Lu 9:11 BethsaidaRest?

11. And the people, when they knew it, followed him: and he received them, and spake unto them of the kingdom of God, and healed them that had need of healing.

- 16. But Jesus said unto them, They need not depart; give ye them to eat.
- 17. And they say unto him, We have here but five loaves, and two fishes.
- 18. He said, Bring them hither to me.
- 19. And he commanded the multitude to sit down on the grass, and took the five loaves, and the two fishes, and looking up to heaven, he blessed, and brake, and gave the loaves to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitude.
- 20. And they did all eat, and were filled: and they took up of the fragments that remained twelve baskets full.
- 21. And they that had eaten were about five thousand men, beside women and children.

Mk 6:35-44 Feed 5000

- 13. But he said unto them, Give ye them to eat. And they said, We have no more but five loaves and two fishes; except we should go and buy meat for all this people.
- 14. For they were about five thousand men. And he said to his disciples, Make them sit down by fifties in a company.

- 5. When Jesus then lifted up his eyes, and saw a great company come unto him, he saith unto Philip, Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?
- 6. And this he said to prove him: for he himself knew what he would do.
- 7. Philip answered him, Two hundred pennyworth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may take a little.
- 8. One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, saith unto him,
- 9. There is a lad here, which hath five barley loaves, and two small fishes: but what are they among so many?
- 10. And Jesus said, Make the men sit down. Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand.
- 11. And Jesus took the loaves; and when he had given thanks, he distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that were set down; and likewise of the fishes as much as they would.
- 12. When they were filled, he said unto his disciples, Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be
- 13. Therefore they gathered them together, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves, which remained over and above unto them that had eaten.

- 23. And when he had sent the multitudes away, he went up into a mountain apart to pray: and when the evening was come, he was there alone.
- 24. But the ship was now in the midst of the sea, tossed with waves: for the wind was contrary.
- 25. And in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went unto them, walking on the sea.
- 26. And when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, It is a spirit; and they cried out for fear.
- 27. But straightway Jesus spake unto them, saying, Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid.
- 28. And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water.
- 29. And he said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus.
- 30. But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me.

- 45. And straightway he constrained his disciples to get into the ship, and to go to the other side before unto Bethsaida, while he sent away the people.
- 46. And when he had sent them away, he departed into a mountain to pray.
- 47. And when even was come, the ship was in the midst of the sea, and he alone on the land.
- 48. And he saw them toiling in rowing; for the wind was contrary unto them: and about the fourth watch of the night he cometh unto them, walking upon the sea, and would have passed by them.
- 49. But when they saw him walking upon the sea, they supposed it had been a spirit, and cried out:
- 50. For they all saw him, and were troubled. And immediately he talked with them, and saith unto them, Be of good cheer: it is I; be not afraid.
- 51. And he went up unto them into the ship; and the wind ceased: and they were sore amazed in themselves beyond measure, and wondered.
- 52. For they considered not the miracle of the loaves: for their heart was hardened.

Jn 6:16-21 Walk On Water-Peter Sinks

- 16. And when even was now come, his disciples went down unto the sea,
- 17. And entered into a ship, and went over the sea toward Capernaum. And it was now dark, and Jesus was not come to them.
- 18. And the sea arose by reason of a great wind that blew.
- 19. So when they had rowed about five and twenty or thirty furlongs, they see Jesus walking on the sea, and drawing nigh unto the ship: and they were afraid.
- 20. But he saith unto them, It is I; be not afraid.
- 21. Then they willingly received him into the ship: and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.

c. Mt 14:34-36 GennesaretTouchGarment

- 34. And when they were gone over, they came into the land of Gennesaret.
- 35. And when the men of that place had knowledge of him, they sent out into all that country round about, and brought unto him all that were diseased;
- 36. And besought him that they might only touch the hem of his garment: and as many as touched were made perfectly whole.

Mk 6:53-56 GennesaretTouchGarment

- 53. And when they had passed over, they came into the land of Gennesaret, and drew to the shore.
- 54. And when they were come out of the ship, straightway they knew him,
- 55. And ran through that whole region round about, and began to carry about in beds those that were sick, where they heard he was.
- 56. And whithersoever he entered, into villages, or cities, or country, they laid the sick in the streets, and besought him that they might touch if it were but the border of his garment: and as many as touched him were made whole.

a. Jn 6:22-40 Caper.-BreadOfLife

- 22. The day following, when the people which stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was none other boat there, save that one whereinto his disciples were entered, and that Jesus went not with his disciples into the boat, but that his disciples were gone away alone;
- 23. (Howbeit there came other boats from Tiberias nigh unto the place where they did eat bread, after that the Lord had given thanks:)
- 24. When the people therefore saw that Jesus was not there, neither his disciples, they also took shipping, and came to Capernaum, seeking for Jesus.
- 25. And when they had found him on the other side of the sea, they said unto him, Rabbi, when camest thou hither?
- 26. Jesus answered them and said, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Ye seek me, not because ye saw the miracles, but because ye did eat of the loaves, and were filled.
- 27. Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed.
- 28. Then said they unto him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?
- 29. Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent.
- 30. They said therefore unto him, What sign shewest thou then, that we may see, and believe thee? what dost thou work?
- 31. Our fathers did eat manna in the desert; as it is written, He gave them bread from heaven to eat.
- 32. Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven.
- 33. For the bread of God is he which cometh down from heaven, and giveth life unto the world.
- 34. Then said they unto him, Lord, evermore give us this bread.
- 35. And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.
- 36. But I said unto you, That ye also have seen me, and believe not.
- 37. All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out.
- 38. For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me.
- 39. And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day.
- 40. And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day.

b. Jn 6:41-51 FromHeaven

- 41. The Jews then murmured at him, because he said, I am the bread which came down from heaven.
- 42. And they said, Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? how is it then that he saith, I came down from heaven?
- 43. Jesus therefore answered and said unto them, Murmur not among yourselves.
- 44. No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day.
- 45. It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me.

- 46. Not that any man hath seen the Father, save he which is of God, he hath seen the Father.
- 47. Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life.
- 48. I am that bread of life.
- 49. Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead.
- 50. This is the bread which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die.
- 51. I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world.

c. Jn 6:52-59 DrinkBloodAlso

- 52. The Jews therefore strove among themselves, saying, How can this man give us his flesh to eat?
- 53. Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ve have no life in you.
- 54. Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day.
- 55. For my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed.
- 56. He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in me, and I in him.
- 57. As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me.
- 58. This is that bread which came down from heaven: not as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead: he that eateth of this bread shall live for ever.
- 59. These things said he in the synagogue, as he taught in Capernaum.

d. Jn 6:60-71 Deserters-1Devil

- 60. Many therefore of his disciples, when they had heard this, said, This is an hard saying; who can hear it?
- 61. When Jesus knew in himself that his disciples murmured at it, he said unto them, Doth this offend you?
- 62. What and if ye shall see the Son of man ascend up where he was before?
- 63. It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.
- 64. But there are some of you that believe not. For Jesus knew from the beginning who they were that believed not, and who should betray him.
- 65. And he said, Therefore said I unto you, that no man can come unto me, except it were given unto him of my Father.
- 66. From that time many of his disciples went back, and walked no more with him.
- 67. Then said Jesus unto the twelve, Will ye also go away?
- 68. Then Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life.
- 69. And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God.
- 70. Jesus answered them, Have not I chosen you twelve, and one of you is a devil?
- 71. He spake of Judas Iscariot the son of Simon: for he it was that should betray him, being one of the twelve.

e. Mt 15:1-20 UnwashedHands

- 1. Then came to Jesus scribes and Pharisees, which were of Jerusalem, saying,
- 2. Why do thy disciples transgress the tradition of the elders? for they wash not their hands when they eat bread.
- 3. But he answered and said unto them, Why do ye also transgress the commandment of God by your tradition?

- 4. For God commanded, saying, Honour thy father and mother: and, He that curseth father or mother, let him die the death.
- 5. But ye say, Whosoever shall say to his father or his mother, It is a gift, by whatsoever thou mightest be profited by me;
- 6. And honour not his father or his mother, he shall be free. Thus have ye made the commandment of God of none effect by your tradition.
- 7. Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying,
- 8. This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me.
- 9. But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.
- 10. And he called the multitude, and said unto them, Hear, and understand:
- 11. Not that which goeth into the mouth defileth a man; but that which cometh out of the mouth, this defileth a man.
- 12. Then came his disciples, and said unto him, Knowest thou that the Pharisees were offended, after they heard this saving?
- 13. But he answered and said, Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up.
- 14. Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch.
- 15. Then answered Peter and said unto him, Declare unto us this parable.
- 16. And Jesus said, Are ye also yet without understanding?
- 17. Do not ye yet understand, that whatsoever entereth in at the mouth goeth into the belly, and is cast out into the draught?
- 18. But those things which proceed out of the mouth come forth from the heart; and they defile the man.
- 19. For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies:
- 20. These are the things which defile a man: but to eat with unwashen hands defileth not a man.

Mk 7:1-23 UnwashedHands

- 1. Then came together unto him the Pharisees, and certain of the scribes, which came from Jerusalem.
- 2. And when they saw some of his disciples eat bread with defiled, that is to say, with unwashen, hands, they found fault.
- 3. For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, except they wash their hands oft, eat not, holding the tradition of the elders.
- 4. And when they come from the market, except they wash, they eat not. And many other things there be, which they have received to hold, as the washing of cups, and pots, brasen vessels, and of tables.
- 5. Then the Pharisees and scribes asked him, Why walk not thy disciples according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashen hands?
- 6. He answered and said unto them, Well hath Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This people honoureth me with their lips, but their heart is far from me.
- 7. Howbeit in vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.
- 8. For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men, as the washing of pots and cups: and many other such like things ve do.

- 9. And he said unto them, Full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition.
- 10. For Moses said, Honour thy father and thy mother; and, Whoso curseth father or mother, let him die the death:
- 11. But ye say, If a man shall say to his father or mother, It is Corban, that is to say, a gift, by whatsoever thou mightest be profited by me; he shall be free.
- 12. And ye suffer him no more to do ought for his father or his mother;
- 13. Making the word of God of none effect through your tradition, which ye have delivered: and many such like things do ye.
- 14. And when he had called all the people unto him, he said unto them, Hearken unto me every one of you, and understand:
- 15. There is nothing from without a man, that entering into him can defile him: but the things which come out of him, those are they that defile the man.
- 16. If any man have ears to hear, let him hear.
- 17. And when he was entered into the house from the people, his disciples asked him concerning the parable.
- 18. And he saith unto them, Are ye so without understanding also? Do ye not perceive, that whatsoever thing from without entereth into the man, it cannot defile him;
- 19. Because it entereth not into his heart, but into the belly, and goeth out into the draught, purging all meats?
- 20. And he said, That which cometh out of the man, that defileth the man.
- 21. For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders,
- 22. Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness:
- 23. All these evil things come from within, and defile the man.
